Year Two



Across KS1, children will develop an awareness and describe the past, chronology, similarity difference, ask and answer questions, use a wide vocabulary of historical terms and Understand some of the ways in which we find out about the past.

A study of the plight of enslaved Africans, the relationship with Liverpool and anti-slavery movement.




Acts of Courage: Friend or Foe?
