- 1. The engagement of all pupils in regular physical activity kick-starting healthy active lifestyles
- 2. The profile of PE and sport being raised across the school as a tool for whole school improvement
 - 3. Increased confidence, knowledge and skills of all staff in teaching PE and sport
 - 4. Broader experience of a range of sports and activities offered to all pupils
 - 5. Increased participation in competitive sport

Stockbridge Village Primary's Vision for the Primary PE and Sports Premium

Stockbridge Village Primary is committed to improving the PE and Sports provision in the school. To help achieve this the school has created an action plan for the 2020/21

The school has received £17,750. £16,000 plus £5 for each pupil in Y1-6, the DfE uses figures from the January 2020 School Census to achieve the final figure.

The school also rolled over funds of £1,450 from the previous year.
